## **NHS Grampian Endowment Funds for Covid-19 Research**

In March 2020, NHS Grampian launched a call for research applications into Covid-19.

The call invited applications for research up to £100,000 from all Grampian researchers. The grants were to support research into Covid-19, with specific interest in work which could help to understand the emerging epidemiology around the Covid-19 pandemic in Grampian and Scotland. There was a particular interest in research to support real-time analyses and modelling to inform the decision making on Covid-19 around how to:

- support the wellbeing and mental health of the population;
- plan support and care for "at risk" groups;
- monitor and manage the outbreak.

The call resulted in 2 projects which were successful. These 2 projects were:
